From Rickshaws to Residents

Kristi Branchford Named Valley VNA Senior Advisor



Kristi Branchford was first introduced to Valley VNA in 2017 when she heard about their new rickshaws through the **Cycling** Without Age bike program for older adults. She was one of the first community volunteers to get trained as a rickshaw pilot, and immediately fell in love with her role as the giver of bike rides and happy smiles to VNA residents. "It was the absolute shining star of my week. I loved it," she said. At the time, she worked 50 to 70 hours a week at another job but refused to cede her rickshaw duties. "It grounded me and gave me energy and joy," she said.

That joy is what propelled Kristi to further invest in Valley VNA as a volunteer bingo-caller. Then she received a ping on her phone in late 2021 about a job opening for the role of Valley VNA Senior Advisor. The senior advisor is the main contact for residents and families who are exploring options for independent senior apartments and assisted living homes. And once a new resident I had come to know and love Valley VNA. I thought if I can help just one family navigate that journey, and help them know what to look for, it would feel so good. Kristi's responsibilities include meeting with families at Valley VNA or in their homes when that's more convenient. She hosts tours of the Valley VNA campus, helps residents and family members complete the necessary paperwork, and guides them when a resident's care needs change. She is a co-facilitator of **Memory** Cafés in Neenah presented by the Fox Valley Memory Project. In her free time, she loves to spend time with her two young adult daughters, Hailey and Grace. Hailey is a biomedical engineer and works in cancer research at Stanford University, Grace attends UW-Oshkosh and has interests in business, sustainability, and social work.

Throughout all these changes, Kristi is still excited when the snow melt means rickshaw season is coming. She will always volunteer as a pilot, "Because when I live in senior care, I know I'll want a bike ride. The experiences I've had on the rickshaws will be on my heart forever."

Campaign, Construction and Remodel Update

Valley VNA, in partnership with the City of Neenah, applied for an American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant in November 2021 in support of our Caring for Generations expansion and remodeling plans. ARPA funds received will complement the generous contributions of community donor-investors in completing several facets of our upcoming construction and remodeling project. Frank Kearny, president of the board of directors at Valley VNA, said this grant opportunity came at an opportune time. "It is serious business based on common sense, especially during this time in history when our population is aging."

Groundbreaking for the proposed expansion is tentatively slated for fall 2022. After construction of an additional memory care wing, the second phase will refurbish existing assisted living spaces with revised floor plans, more natural light, and modern finishes. Preliminary plans include creating assisted-living residents' rooms to include small private living/visiting spaces adjacent to their customary sleeping space. Bathrooms will be enlarged to afford more comfort and safety to residents and staff. Valley VNA will also invest in residential-style kitchens that serve a smaller number of residents than a large dining room.

5 Generations of Employees

Although they are not all related by blood, we count *five distinct generations* within our employment base. From teens exploring nursing careers as certified nursing assistants to older adults who work as caregivers and personal companions, our staff members truly represent the generations of caring that make Valley VNA a wonderful and unique place to live and work.

11,345 Minutes of Cycling Without Age



Valley VNA's 21 Cycling Without Age volunteer rickshaw pilots provided 155 rides to 211 lucky riders for a total of 11,345 minutes on wheels in 2021. This included mostly resident rides, in addition to rides for the Fox Valley Memory Project Memory Café, the Memory Care Respite Partners, and the July 3 Neenah Light Parade.

9 Years Together



Marcia Siebers, a personal care worker for Valley VNA's In-Home Care division, joined the organization in 2001 and came to know resident Erma Peters, 104, in 2012. Marcia, 74, is now partially retired but still fills the role of friend and companion for Erma through Valley VNA. "I made a promise to Erma that I wouldn't retire until she didn't need me anymore, and Valley VNA lets me stay on just for her."


